

## Learning German at a German „Gymnasium“

You are from abroad? You are moving to Munich?  
Your child is to learn German at a German school?



**The Adolf-Weber-Gymnasium in Munich**  
offers a German transition-year course for pupils from 11 to 15  
years.

**More than a German language course:**

**The language preparation classes at the Adolf-Weber-Gymnasium.**

**The objective of the one-year-course is:**

**T**o enable your child:

- to follow all lessons by training listening and reading comprehension
- to independently expand specific vocabulary needed for each subject
- to write comprehensible texts and essays as required in the German “Gymnasium”
- to understand solution-based tasks.

**T**o integrate your child into the regular class in the “Gymnasium” in three steps:

- Step 1: language preparation year
- Step 2: admission as a so-called “guest pupil” after one year of German preparation class
- Step 3: admission as a regular pupil after “guest”-status-year.

**T**o support you in case we recommend a change of school form after the language preparation class.

## Structure of the course

### 1. First phase:

Intensive German course (25 lessons per week)

Lesson in English.

Lesson in Maths.

**2. First evaluation** of the pupil's progress and further decisions taken by teacher team. See 3.

### 3. Second phase:

Intensive German course

Lesson in English

Lesson in Maths

If fit and/or necessary, integration into some subjects of regular classes according to age.

**4. Second evaluation** by teachers on

- progress of the pupil with regard to the demands of the German "Gymnasium"

- extended integration into a regular class

**5. Continuation** of 3.

**6. Final evaluation** and decision whether the pupil can manage the upcoming demands in a regular class and school counselling.
